 was founded William L. White in Birmingham, Alabama around 1923. This organization was brought forth by the lack of organizations for young men to come together in fellowship while serving the community. Women were welcomed in the mid 1980's.

These charter members saw the need for therapists growing in America and decided to fund scholarships for therapists on a national level. The thought behind the therapist scholarships

was that an AMBUCS club could get together and raise money to give the form of scholarships to therapists who will in turn touch countless lives for the better. The AMTRYKE program is another national program designed to give disabled youngsters their first set of wheels—a therapeutic tricycle designed to be either foot OR hand driven.

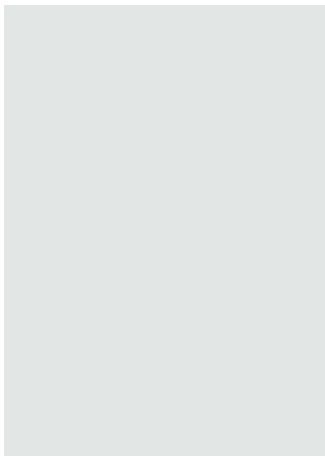
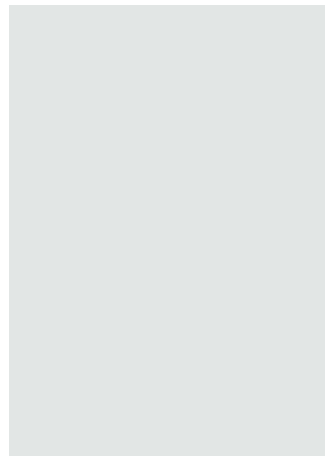
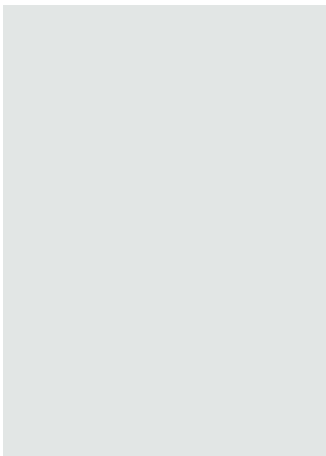
Along with the national obligations, each individual club decides how they will spend their money. Perfect exam-

H.U.B. City Playground



Opened in April 2003, the 20,000 square foot AMBUCS HUB City Playground provides integrated play/learn structures for the enjoyment of children of all ages and abilities. This nationally recognized play-

ground is wheelchair accessible and offers numerous bridges, slides and lookouts. Other amenities include a wheelchair accessible sandbox and swing area. Located near the medical community, the playground has been an ideal location for physical therapy sessions. The playground was designed with sun safety in mind because many children with disabilities have a limited tolerance to sun exposure. Therefore, the structures

include many shaded areas. Future improvements include the construction of a new shade structure for the picnic area adjacent to the playground allowing for a more enjoyable and safe play experience at the park. The community has raised \$10,000 to assist with the replacement of the shade structure, and the City of Lubbock is grateful for the many individuals who helped contribute to this fund.

Therapeutic AMTRYKES & Scholarships for Therapists

AmBility and AMBUCS Scholars are the two national service projects of AMBUCS. Within the AmBility project is the AmTryke program. This program is designed to give children with disabilities their first set of wheels. This unique therapeutic tricycle is hand and/or foot driven. It improves motor coordination, increases self-esteem and is fun to ride!

A long-running success story, the AMBUCS Scholars- Scholarships for Therapists, project represents the

largest single private source of educational grants for therapists in America. AMBUCS has provided over 5 million dollars to educate physical and occupational therapists, speech pathologists and hearing audiologists.

Both of these projects are powerful symbols of our club's national mission: to create independence for people with disabilities.
